HPCSA REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION OF SPECIALISTS

REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION OF SPECIALISTS – FORM 57 IMPLEMENTATION

The HPCSA reaffirmed the decision espoused in their communiqué to all Medical Deans. The requirements for the registration as specialist in South Africa for registrars who commenced training from 1 January 2011 are as follows:

- i. Evidence of integrated assessment during the stipulated training period (proof of training/vocational time);
- ii. Completion of a national curriculum and national professional examinations of exit level outcomes 1 and 2 (fellowship qualification);
- iii. Completion of a research methodology course; and
- iv. Completion of a research component.

Requirements for completion of a 'research component' (see point IV) the HPCSA confirmed the following: Attendance of a basic research methodology course, (b) Approval of a relevant protocol, © Passing the research assignment (either by having been marked by an external examiner or by having published in a peer-reviewed publication Registrars, who have not complied with the above requirements, will not be registered as specialists and will be deemed as not having met the training standards of the respective specialist programs.

However the HPCSA has further informed UKZN that the Board of the HPCSA has resolved to grant the following concession in regard to compliance with paragraph c above, as follows:

"Those who submitted their dissertation for marking have an extension up to the end of 2019 for registration" This applies to those who wrote the CMSA examination up to October 2019. However the HPCSA was unequivocal that "passing of the research assignment" will be a prerequisite from 2020 with no further concessions being granted
