BOOKS NEW REQUIREMENT FROM THE DHET

A written justification (maximum 500 words) signed by the author of the book explaining the contribution that the book makes to scholarship must be attached to each publication claim. This justification should not be an abstract of the contents or preface of the book, but should, rather, describe the methodology used as well as the unique contribution made to knowledge production. It should be clear that the book against which subsidy is being claimed disseminates original research and new developments within the specific discipline.

As part of the justification, there must be unequivocal declaration to the fact that no part of the work was plagiarized or published elsewhere. The target audience must be stated.

CHAPTERS IN BOOKS NEW REQUIREMENT FROM THE DHET

A written justification (maximum 500 words) signed by the general editor (in the case of an edited book with several chapters from various contributors) explaining the contribution that the book makes to scholarship must be attached to each publication claim.

This justification should not be an abstract of the contents or preface of the book, but should, rather, describe the methodology

used as well as the unique contribution made to knowledge production. It should be clear that the chapter against which subsidy is being claimed disseminates original research and new developments within the specific discipline. As part of the justification, there must be unequivocal declaration to the fact that no part of the work was plagiarized or published elsewhere. The target audience must be stated. Chapters without the requisite information in the "Justification" will not be submitted to the DHET for subsidy purpose.
